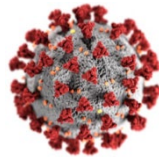

Harlingen Will Hold Four Vaccine Clinics This Week



Harlingen, Texas—The City of Harlingen has partnered with the Harlingen Consolidated Independent School District to provide the Pediatric Pfizer Vaccine to children five to 11 this week. The City will hold four vaccine clinics this week and two will be specifically for children, parents, and teachers.

On Thursday, Nov 18 the Pediatric Pfizer Vaccines will be administered at Long Elementary and Travis Elementary from 3-7 p.m. These two clinics are open to all HCISD students, parents, and staff who need a booster, 1st or 2nd dose of Pfizer, Moderna, or J& J.

On Wednesday, Nov 17, Pfizer, Moderna, & J&J Vaccines and Boosters will be administered at the Harlingen Health Department located at 502 E. Tyler from 1-7 p.m. and on Saturday, Nov 20 at the Harlingen Convention Center from 10 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Pediatric Pfizer Vaccine

- 5 to 11 years old

Pfizer Vaccine

- 1st & 2nd dose for 12 & older

Pfizer Booster (6-months after initial series)

- 65 and older
- 18 and older with underlying medical conditions
- 18 and older who work or live in high-risk settings.

Moderna Vaccine

- 1st & 2nd dose 18 and older

Moderna Booster (6-months after initial series)

- 65 and older
- 18 and older with underlying medical conditions
- 18 and older who work or live in high-risk settings

Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

- 1st dose 18 and older

Johnson & Johnson Booster (2-months after the initial vaccine)

- 18 and older

An appointment is not needed to get the vaccine/booster.

As a reminder, the City's Vaccine Incentive Program runs through the end of November. Cameron County residents are eligible to get a \$50 gift card for getting the first dose of any of the COVID-19 vaccines. CAMCO children five to 11 are also eligible.
