Harlingen to Hold Massive 1st Dose Vaccine Clinic on Wednesday

Harlingen, Texas—The City of Harlingen will administer 3,000 first doses of the Moderna Vaccine on Wednesday, April 7, 2021, at the Harlingen Convention Center from 6 a.m. - 12 p.m. This massive vaccine clinic is for people 18 and older.


The City of Harlingen has again partnered with Cameron County Public Health, Valley Baptist Hospital, South Texas Emergency Care Foundation, the Harlingen Consolidated Independent School District, and the Texas State Technical College Nursing Program to administer the 3000 doses of the Moderna Vaccine. This is the sixth clinic for the City and the largest since partnering with the County to host and administer the vaccines.

The administration of the doses will be done in three sessions on Wednesday—an early morning session from 6-9 a.m. and a mid-morning session from 8 - 11 a.m. and a late morning session from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m.

A wristband is required and can be obtained tomorrow, Tuesday, April 6 at the Harlingen Convention Center located at 701 Harlingen Heights Drive. The wristbands will be distributed beginning at 8 a.m. until they run out. No overnight parking is allowed to get a wristband.

People aged 18 and older with a wristband are guaranteed a vaccine this Wednesday, April 7 so there is no need to line up the day before and overnight parking will not be permitted either.

Access to the Harlingen Convention Center for Tuesday’s wristband distribution and Wednesday’s clinic will be through Brazil Road off of Spur 54.

Brazil Road will be closed to through traffic until 5 a.m. to discourage overnight parking.
