CBP Announces Temporary Hours Changes at Los Indios and other Ports of Entry

HARLINGEN, Texas– U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Office of Field Operations (OFO) reported today that bridge hours for vehicular traffic at select international bridges within the Laredo Field Office operational area, which extends from Brownsville to Del Rio are changing starting Monday, April 6,

In a press release, the government agency stated the changes are due to the COVID-19 pandemic which has significantly decreased vehicular traffic. CBP in agreement with Servicio de Administracion Tributaria (SAT) will implement necessary measures in compliance with federal social distancing guidelines to ensure the health and safety of CBP and SAT workers as well as the traveling public.

“These temporary hours changes will enable CBP and SAT to maximize resources, continue our ability to provide essential services to the public and observe necessary safety requirements for our employees across the Laredo Field Office area of operations,” said Randy J. Howe, Director, Field Operations, Laredo Field Office.

Starting on April 6, 2020, the Free Trade Bridge at Los Indios will only be open from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. for processing of northbound passenger vehicle traffic.

CBP reports that the hours of operation for the processing of northbound passenger vehicle traffic is as follows for the bridges listed below:

Eagle Pass International Bridge I: 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Falcon Dam International Bridge: 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. (since April 2)

Rio Grande City International Bridge: 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Anzalduas International Bridge: 6 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Donna-Rio Bravo International Bridge: 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday-Sunday. At 4 p.m. the port will cease processing operations and all northbound and southbound traffic will cease.

B&M International Bridge: 6 a.m. to 11:59 p.m.

At Amistad Dam International Bridge, international traffic will be temporarily suspended on April 4.

CBP says that those who still need to travel internationally through crossing with reduced hours of operation will be directed to the next nearest crossing with longer or 24-hour service.

To avoid any potential delays, CBP encourages travelers to download the CBP Border Wait Times App through their mobile device. The CBP [Border Wait Times](#) app displays live estimated wait times and open lane statuses at U.S. land ports of entry.
