Residents Urged to Report Storm Damage

Harlingen, Texas—City officials continue recovery efforts caused by last week's storm that left many areas temporarily flooded. In order to receive assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Cameron County must meet a threshold of \$1.4 million of estimated damages.

City Manager Dan Serna says it is imperative that residents report damages to the City so we can ensure that FEMA will help our community as a whole and on an individual basis.

The City of Harlingen has set up an email that allows residents to report their damage assessment and pictures. Residents can make their report in English or in Spanish here reporthgn@myharlingen.us.

They will need to provide their address, type of residence, how much water was in their home or business, their estimate of damage in dollars, and pictures if they have any.

Again, in order to get FEMA help, we must meet a \$1.4 million threshold in Cameron County alone. Valley wide we must meet a combined \$38 million threshold so every dollar counts.

The City of Harlingen urges resident not to wait on reporting any damage. For more information, they can call the Public Works Department at (956) 216-5300.
